### INS Tabar deployed for naval exercises in Africa, Europe



 INS Tabar is the third of the Talwarclass frigate of the Indian Navy.

- The frigate was commissioned on 19 April 2004 in Kaliningrad, Russia with Captain Biswajit Dasgupta.
- INS Tabar, a vessel in the Talwar class to be armed with supersonic BrahMos anti-ship cruise missiles.
- She is also equipped with Barak 1 missiles.
- Indian Naval Ship Tabar commenced her prolonged deployment on June 13.
- It will visit a number of ports in Africa and Europe till the end of September.

- It will also participate in a number of joint exercises with friendly navies.
- The ship will transit across the Gulf of Aden, Red Sea, Suez Canal, Mediterranean Sea, North Sea and Baltic Sea while making port calls at Djibouti, Egypt, Italy, France, UK, Russia, Netherlands, Morocco, and Arctic Council countries like Sweden and Norway.
- These engagements are aimed to further strengthen maritime security in the region and to consolidate combined operations against maritime threats.
- The deployment will also see participation by the ship in the Russian Navy Day celebrations from July 22 to 27.

# Rajasthan makes it mandatory to have at least 1 vaccine shot to enter public places



- The Rajasthan government on Saturday made it mandatory for people to have at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine to enter public places from Monday, June 28 onward.
- This was a part of the state government's guidelines, according to which offices with at least 60% of staff inoculated with at least one vaccine dose can function with 100% workforce.

## NASA's satellite data used to track ocean microplastics from space



- Scientists have developed a way to use NASA satellite data to track movement of tiny plastic pieces in the ocean from space.
- The technique relies on NASA's constellation of eight small satellites, CYGNSS, that uses radar to measure ocean roughness which is affected by factors like wind speed and debris.
- Scientists found microplastics tended to be present in smoother waters.
