

'Snoopy' to fly to Moon on NASA mission as zero-gravity indicator



- NASA will send a plush toy version of Peanuts character 'Snoopy' aboard its unmanned Artemis I mission around the Moon as the zero-gravity indicator.
- 'Snoopy' will be dressed in a custom-made orange spacesuit, made from the same materials that will be worn by astronauts on future Artemis missions.
- It will ride along with a manikin and two phantom human torsos.

- The Red Rebel Brigade arrived in Glasgow to join forces with Scotland's Blue Rebels in holding world leaders to account during the COP26 Climate Summit.
- An international performance artivist troupe dedicated to illuminating the global environmental crisis and supporting groups and organisations fighting to save humanity and all species from mass extinction.
- The Red Rebel Brigade symbolises the common blood we share with all species, that unifies us and makes us one,
- Red Rebel Brigade was devised by Doug Francisco and Justine Squire from Bristol's Invisible Circus for the Extinction Rebellion Spring uprising April 2019 in London.
- These ethereal otherworldly beings came from a slow motion mime show called Blanco that Invisible Circus toured for many years as a street show in the 90's.

- Red Rebel Brigade is an evolution of these ghostly all white characters that first processed for the Anti Iraq war demonstrations in 2003.
- The choice of red as the colour was part aesthetic and part symbolic, creating a very strong contrasting visual and resonating with emotive responses to the colour, red symbolising blood, danger, passion, stop signs etc.

- The memorial, dedicated to those who laid down their lives in the Battle of Rezang La during the 1962 war, now includes the names of Army personnel who lost their lives in the violent clash at Galwan last year.

Annapurna idol stolen from UP back from Canada after 100 years



- An idol of Goddess Annapurna that was stolen from Varanasi about 100 years ago and later found in Canada recently is all set to be back at its rightful place and will be gracing the Kashi Vishwanath Temple in Varanasi.
- It is 17 cm in height, 9 cm in breadth and 4 cm in thickness.
- The idol which has reached Delhi will be taken to Aligarh, from where it will be taken to Kanauj on November 12 and then a day later will go to Ayodhya on November 14. After that, the idol will be finally taken to Varanasi on November 15 to be taken to the Kashi Vishwanath Temple. The return of the Annapurna idol comes in the wake of many such antiquities being identified and returned to the country in the past couple of years.
